Medical societies play a pivotal role in shaping healthcare policy by advocating for legislative priorities that impact patient care, physician well-being, and public health.

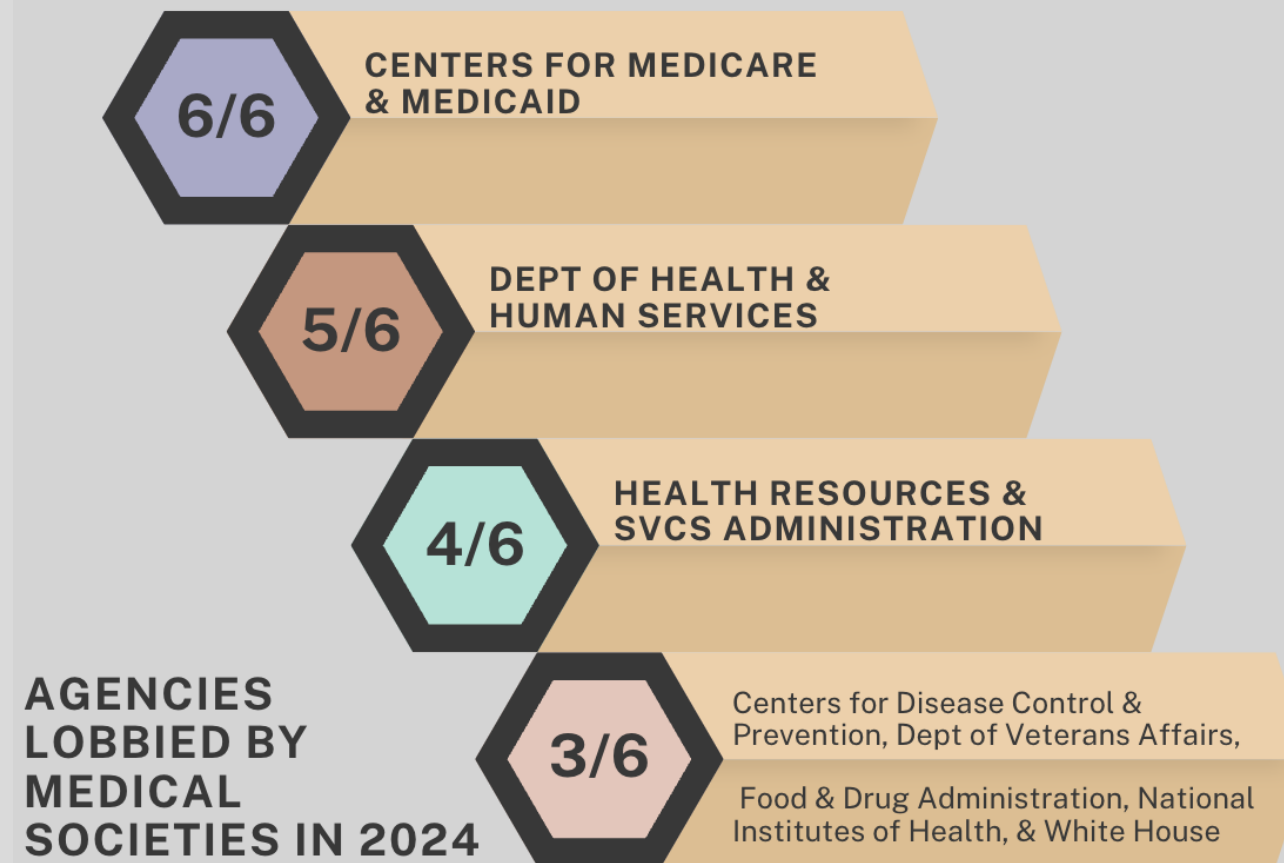
We examined the **legislative priorities, political contribution overlaps, and federal agencies lobbied** by six major medical societies

- American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP)

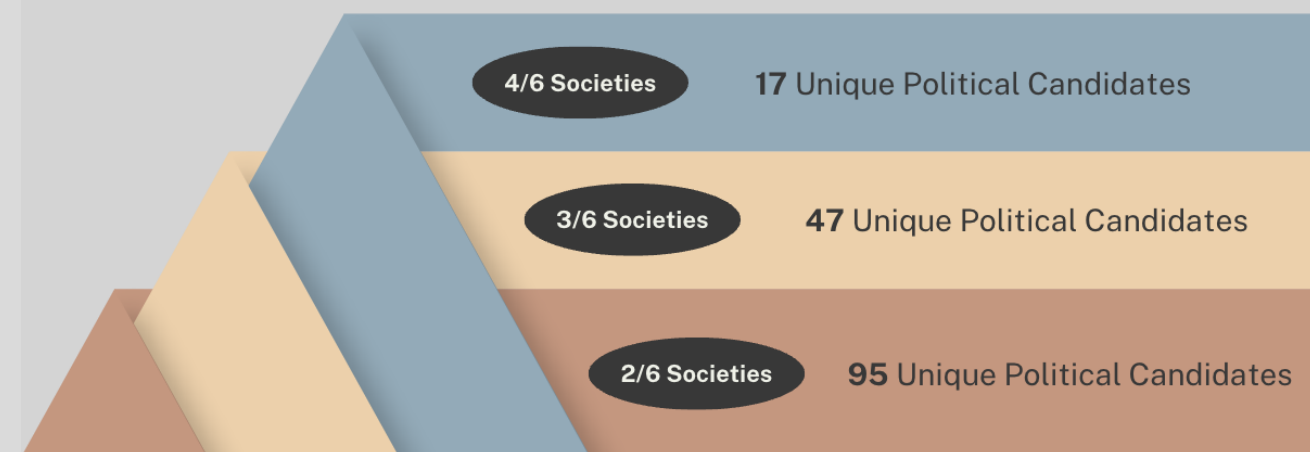
By understanding the **alignment of advocacy efforts**, we can better coordinate policy strategies to enhance physician representation and healthcare outcomes.

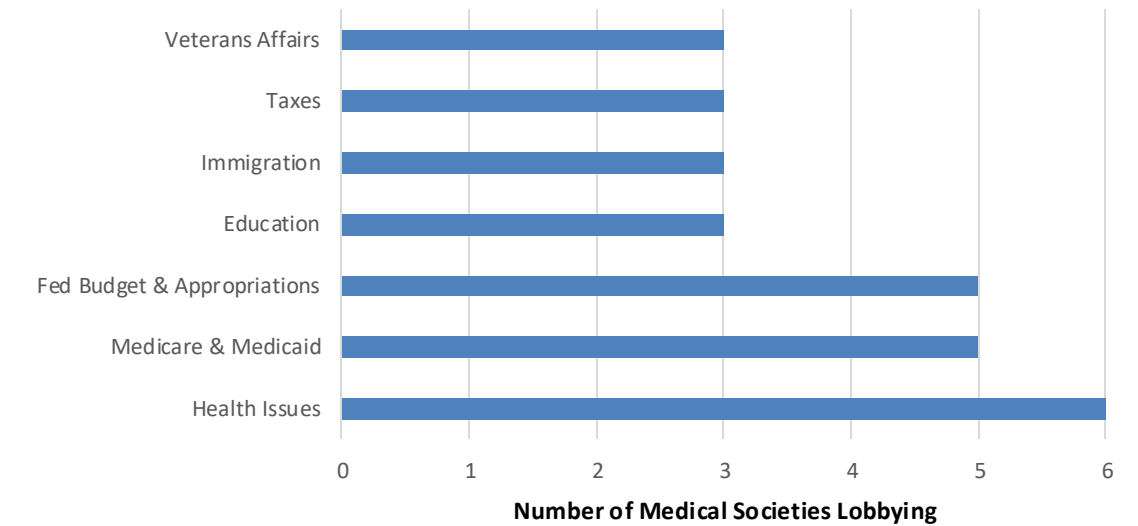
